New Hordville Center Holds Open House

The efforts of the Hordville Community Club were turned into reality Sunday when the Community Center building officially opened its doors to the public. The Sunday open house attended by nearly 200 people ended a near-three year effort by the Community Club and Hordville citizens to modernize the former Veberg Seed building into a facility that could be used by the entire community. The building was purchased by the Village of Hordville in 1977 with the intended use

as a village hall and community center. Through the efforts of fund raising events, donated labor, hired labor and plenty of goodwill the dream of Hordville residents was finalized. The new center located on main street just across from the senior citizen housing project, required complete gutting of the 25 x 60 foot Veberg building and transformation of that structure to house a village board meeting room, a large meeting or

dining area, a kitchen, restrooms and storage. The Community Club still needs dishes and silverware as well as a coat rack, drapes and a 55 cup coffee pot. Besides being a home for the Village of Hordville board, it will also serve as a meeting place for 4-H groups, the community club, Lions Club and can be rented to private individuals for family dinners and senior citizen events.
